REPORT TO THE BOARD, SAN JOAQUIN COUNTY CLINICS

Background: Binational Health Week

- 2019 marks the 19th year of the Binational Health celebrations.
- The Binational Health Week is a mobilization effort focused improving the health and well-being of the underserved. It started out being focused on Latinos but has expanded its goal to embrace all underserved communities across the United States and Canada and European countries.
- It builds cooperative relationships among government, faith and community organizations.
- In San Joaquin County, it is a month-long observation, with several events organized to foster the spirit of Binational Health. Leadership is provided by the Binational Health Coalition.

SJGH/SJCC Binational Health Contributions

Leadership: SJGH/SJCC provided leadership to the Binational Health Coalition. Coalition meetings were held at the SJGH/SJCC Innovation Lab to plan and coordinate activities.

Binational Health Month Kick-Off: SJGH/SJCC kicked off San Joaquin County's observation of Binational Health, with a breakfast meeting attended by over 60 community leaders and representatives of community organizations.

Outreach and Promotions: SJGH/SJCC conducted a number of activities that promoted both Binational Health and the county clinics and hospital. This included presentations at the County Board of Supervisors, HPSJ and WorkNet Leadership events on Binational Health, Voice of San Joaquin Radio interview, coverage in Latino Times and other radio/newspaper ads.

Community Engagement: This year's participation in the countywide event gave us the opportunity to be regarded as a leader in community organizing and engagement. Already, we have been approached to take part in other community-wide efforts in social and health focused efforts.

EVENT HIGHLIGHTS

Celebration of Wellness 2019

The Event: SJGH/SJCC called its health event the Celebration of Wellness 2019, aligning it with the countywide theme of Healthy Families, Healthy Communities. Estimated attendance is 600. Feedback forms were completed by 194 individuals, all expressing very positive response and suggestions for expansion in the next year.

Community Partners:

- Forty (40) health and social organizations participated.
- Regional Transit District provided free bus rides.
- El Concilio provided shuttle service to migrant camps.
- Live announcements through Entravision Radio.

Services Provided:

- Flu Shots: 180 individuals received flu shots. CSU Stanislaus provided volunteers and SJC Public Health Services provided the flu vaccine.
- Mammograms: 28 women received mammograms
- Health Screenings: About 200 health screenings were provided to individuals. This included Blood Pressure checks, BMI assessments and Blood Glucose Checks.
 Volunteers provided the services: BP and BMI checks -San Joaquin Delta College; and Blood Glucose checks by Xavier College.
- Provider Consultations: Family Medicine Clinic and the Pharmacy team provided free consultations, reviewing the health screening results and answering health concerns. Recommendations were provided including same day appointments to the clinics.
- Clinics: Family Medicine Clinic was open for the four hours of the event. Among the services offered were women's health exams such as pap smears and breast exams, diabetic screenings for patients who were found to have a high sugar level at the initial health screening, adult and pediatric health services.
- Women's Health Class: Health Plan of San Joaquin conducted the class. Planned for only 20, the class drew 40 women.
- Healthy Eating Consultation and Healthy Food: Sutter Gould provided one-on-one consultation and a bag of free fruit and vegetables. They reported serving up to 500 adults and teens.
- Entertainment: Jazzercise, Native American dances,
 Zumba, and music by In-Shape City, Annunciation Church,
 and other organizations.
